




Femshion: A platform where fashion and women empowerment meets startups!





The Tiktok Ban: "No More Dances!"

TikTok, a home to dance challenges, lip-sync battles, and oddly addictive cleaning videos, has been banned by multiple countries over the years. But why? Did it upload an embarrassing dance video of a world leader? Did it forget to like someone's cat video? Let's unravel the mystery behind these bans and see who dared to swipe left on TikTok.

The use of TikTok has both pros and cons, as individuals find it as a platform to express creativity through short videos using music, filters, and effects. It's especially popular for dance, comedy, and storytelling content.

TikTok connects user's worldwide, fostering cultural exchange and giving a platform to diverse voices and ideas. The algorithm promotes content based on engagement, and not follower count, allowing unknown creators to go viral and gain recognition.

Moreover, with a vast library of videos tailored to user preferences, TikTok offers endless entertainment. Beyond just entertainment, TikTok also hosts educational videos on topics like cooking, science, fitness and mental health, making learning more engaging.

However, TikTok has faced scrutiny over its data collection practices and potential misuse of user information, raising concerns about user privacy.



Its infinite scrolling feature and engaging content can lead to excessive screen time and addiction, particularly among younger users. Despite moderation efforts, inappropriate or harmful content can still circulate, posing risks to younger audiences. Constant exposure to idealized lifestyles or trends can lead to feelings of inadequacy, anxiety, or low self-esteem.

Despite age restrictions, younger children often access the app, exposing them to content that may not be age-appropriate. Countries didn't ban TikTok just because they got tired of the "Renegade" challenge. Instead, Governments were worried TikTok might collect user data and send it straight to... China! Whether this was a genuine threat or a "Big Brother paranoia moment," nobody knows for sure. Some countries believe TikTok could be a Trojan horse, a seemingly harmless app that could spy on sensitive information. Imagine hackers snooping on military secrets while also watching cringe-worthy dance moves. TikTok's unfiltered, user-generated content was seen as inappropriate or harmful in some places. Apparently, some governments thought their citizens needed less TikTok cringe and more real-world cringe.

Here's a (non-exhaustive) list of countries that raised the "No TikTok" sign:

- (1) India: In 2020, India decided TikTok wasn't "desi" enough and banned it, citing national security concerns. Millions of creators were devastated, but *Chingari* and *Moj* (Indian alternatives) quickly stepped in, proving that Bollywood-level drama doesn't need TikTok.
- (2) United States (Almost): The U.S. threatened to ban TikTok during Donald Trump's presidency, labeling it a spy in disguise. While the ban didn't fully go through, TikTok users were momentarily worried they'd have to record their dances on... Facebook.
- (3) Pakistan: TikTok was banned multiple times in Pakistan for "immoral and indecent content." Apparently, some videos didn't align with their cultural and moral values. But each ban was quickly lifted, proving TikTok is as resilient as its creators.
- (4) Afghanistan: Under the Taliban, Afghanistan banned TikTok, claiming it corrupted the youth. Because, of course, it's TikTok that does that, not... anything else.
- (5) Indonesia & Bangladesh: Both banned TikTok temporarily for hosting "inappropriate content." Clearly, these governments weren't fans of prank videos.

DO PEOPLE STILL USE TIKTOK?

The answer is a resounding YES. Bans haven't stopped diehard TikTok fans from finding creative ways around restrictions. VPNs (Virtual Private Networks) have become the holy grail for those who refuse to let go of their 15 seconds of fame.

In India, creators simply switched platforms, but nostalgia for TikTok still lingers. In Pakistan, every ban was met with public outcry, leading to its swift return.

Sure, there are valid concerns surrounding data privacy and national security. However, banning TikTok is similar to blaming the dog for your bad grades, simply because it danced around too much.

The app is merely a tool; how it's used (or misused) ultimately depends on the users. The saga surrounding the TikTok ban is a curious blend of serious issues and outright absurdity. Whether you support or oppose TikTok, one thing is undeniable: the app has firmly established itself in the hearts (and phones) of millions. For every country that attempts to ban it, there's another user out there finding a workaround to post their next viral video. 
WHEN THE SMOKE CLEARS: THE FRAGILE PATH TO PEACEIN GAZA

The Israel-Palestine conflict, rooted in decades of territorial disputes, human rights concerns, and political tensions, continues to escalate, drawing attention to the dire situation in Palestinian territories. Recent violence has heightened calls for a ceasefire, but achieving a lasting resolution remains a complex challenge. The conflict traces its origins to the 1967 Six-Day War, during which Israel captured the West Bank and Gaza Strip (territories that Palestinians envision as part of a future state). Israel's ongoing occupation of the West Bank and its blockade of Gaza have significantly exacerbated international tensions and fuelled widespread anger and resentment.

The Gaza Strip, home to over two million Palestinians, has become the epicentre of the crisis. The blockade imposed by Israel since 2007 and the recent ongoing military targeting has turned Gaza into what has been described as an open-air prison. Access to food, clean water, and medical supplies is severely restricted. Electricity shortages are rampant, and many families are forced to live in overcrowded, makeshift homes amidst the rubble.

Likewise, in the West Bank, Palestinians face a different form of violence. Israeli expansion in this occupied territory continues unabated, despite international condemnation. These settlements, built on land seized from Palestinians, are often guarded by Israeli soldiers, and Palestinian residents live under constant threat of displacement. Military checkpoints, curfews, and restrictions on movement create a system of apartheid that limits the freedom and dignity of Palestinians.

In the past, temporary ceasefires have been brokered between Israel and Palestinian factions, often in response to mounting pressure from the international community or regional powers. However, these ceasefires have been short-lived, and the underlying causes of the conflict remain unresolved.



The main obstacle to a lasting ceasefire is the lack of political will to negotiate a comprehensive peace agreement. Israel continues to prioritize security concerns, citing the threat posed by militant groups like Hamas, which govern Gaza. Hamas, on the other hand, continues to demand an end to the Israeli blockade and the recognition of Palestinian statehood.

As of date, Israel and the Palestinian group Hamas have agreed to a ceasefire, after more than 460 days of a war that has devastated Gaza. The deal includes three phases of which only the first, which will last 6 weeks, has been detailed. It includes prisoner exchange, the partial withdrawal of Israeli troops in Gaza and a surge of aid into the enclave.

Israel will allow civilians to return to their homes in the enclave's besieged north, where aid agencies warn famine may have taken hold, and allow a surge of aid into the enclave which includes up to 600 trucks each day. Israel will also allow wounded Palestinians to leave the Gaza Strip for treatment, and open the Rafah crossing with Egypt seven days after the start of the implementation of the first phase.

Israeli forces will also reduce their presence in the Philadelphi Corridor, the border area between Egypt and Gaza, and then withdraw completely no later than the 50th day after the deal comes into effect. Details of the second and third phases, though understood to be agreed to in principle, are to be negotiated during the first phase. US President Joe Biden has said that the ceasefire will continue even if the negotiations on the second and third phases go beyond the initial six weeks of the first phase. Critically, Israel has insisted that no written guarantees be given to rule out a resumption of its attacks once the first phase is complete and its civilian captives returned.

However, according to an Egyptian source cited by the Associated Press news agency, the three mediators involved in the talks, Egypt, Qatar and the United States, have given Hamas verbal guarantees that negotiations will continue and that all three would press for a deal that would see the second and third stages implemented before an initial six-week window has elapsed. There is currently no agreement over who will administer Gaza beyond the ceasefire. The United States has pressed for a reformed version of the Palestinian Authority to do so.

The recent ceasefire between Israel and Hamas has opened a critical dialogue on the future governance of Gaza. For any sustainable plan to succeed, it necessitates the support of Arab states, notably Saudi Arabia, which has emphasized normalization with Israel is contingent on a clear pathway to Palestinian statehood. This stance introduces a significant point of contention among Israeli lawmakers, especially considering Israel's historical agreement to a two-state solution during the Oslo Accords in the 1990s. Israel has yet to propose an alternative governance model for Gaza. Proposals from Israeli officials have varied, with some suggesting that the Palestinian Authority (PA) should gradually assume control over Gaza, while others advocate for continued Israeli security oversight. However, these plans have faced internal opposition and have not been fully detailed.

In the absence of a clear governance framework, the future stability of a potential Palestinian state remains uncertain. The international community continues to call for a comprehensive and viable solution that addresses the livelihood and aspirations of the Palestinian people.



PAST PERCEPTIONS

HOW TO REWRITIE OURSELVES, DESPITE OUR PASTS

Humans experience emotions on a profound level, and even the slightest shift in someone's attitude can lead to the drifting apart of two people. Suppressing these emotions can result in severe depression, while acting impulsively on them can wreak havoc on one's life. Yet, as life unfolds, everything happens for a reason, and each experience often serves as a lesson that prepares us for something greater. A poignant exploration of this concept is found in the book "The Courage to be Disliked," where the notion of change is beautifully illustrated through conversation between an inexperienced "young man" and a seasoned "Philosopher."

In their first exchange, the young man asks a seemingly simple question: "Can people change and find happiness?" The Philosopher responds affirmatively: "Yes, without exception." However, such straightforward answer does little to quell the young man's curiosity. This leads the conversation to deepen further as the young man expresses doubt, setting aside the pursuit of happiness to focus simply on the question of whether people can change. He answers his own query by acknowledging that change is difficult; if it weren't, people wouldn't take it so seriously and would not seek solace in religion or dubious self-help seminars. The Philosopher, intrigued by the young man's stance, asks why is he so insistent on this notion of change.

The young man continues by citing his friend as an example; a person who has led an isolated, antisocial life, confined to his room. This individual now desires to change, hoping to get a job and improve his life.



The young man attributes his friend's behavior to early childhood trauma, perhaps caused by his parents or even a bully who convinced him that the outside world is hostile. Essentially, the young man believes that there was a "cause" in his friend's life that resulted in the "effect" of his current antisocial behavior.

At this point, the Philosopher challenges the young man's perspective with a thought-provoking question: if trauma indeed shaped his friend in such a way, wouldn't people with similar experiences all turn out the same? In other words, if past trauma dictates the future, then doesn't this imply that our futures are already determined and unchangeable? This idea, rooted in Adlerian psychology, causes the young man to reflect deeply on whether the past truly holds such power over one's life.

The Philosopher proceeds by drawing a distinction between two concepts: the fear of stepping outside and the trauma that causes one to remain indoors. He suggests that fear is something that is constructed, created in the mind, but it is not a permanent state. A person can change unless they are still holding onto some aspect of their past, unable to release it in order to evolve. The Philosopher introduces two terms to explain this: "Aetiology," which is the study of causes, and "Teleology," which asserts that every event serves a purpose in life. The difference lies not in the events themselves but in how one perceives and applies them to life in order to move forward.

This conversation raises an essential point: while our past may influence us, it is not an unalterable blueprint for our future. The key to change lies not in the events themselves, but in how we choose to interpret and respond to them. The Young man begins to question whether holding onto the past is preventing his friend, and others from embracing change. The Philosopher's words challenge the very foundation of how we view trauma and the potential for transformation, offering a perspective that the future is not set in stone, but can be shaped by how we understand and apply our experiences.

Why Your Brain Needs More Than Just Memes: The Importance of Art and Literature


